Visiting Ethiopia

I wanted to share with you my experience of visiting the villages in Ethiopia. The beauty of the country took us by surprise and that before we came to our first village. We'd been in Ethiopia for 12 days, down south via Lake Awash, the Bale Mtns, around Addis Ababa and going onto Lalibella, Gondar and Axum on 'The Historic Route'.

When met by REST [the NGO responsible for construction, monitoring etc of the HDW programme] staff in Axum, I thought we'd seen it all. How wrong I was, in more ways than one. Tigray for me was one of drought and famine, a harsh dry land [impressions formed by pictures of the well documented famines]. But no, it's a beautiful area, canyons, tablelands and lovely rock formations, though definitely dry in 2003. We travelled many short distances of 50 to 75 kms to the villages where wells had been constructed or were being surveyed, the journey taking up to 2 hrs to reach isolated villages. Often the last kilometre or so was walked, though the scenery was always stunning.



Our first village set the tone for following visits – we'd left the vehicles to walk the last few hundred metres – the REST guys were in front and turned to us with astonishment and smiles saying – be prepared. We could hear singing and drumming and as Ross came over a small rise, he stepped back. His eyes started to water, he adjusted his cap and put on his sunglasses, turned to me and said, 'you are not going to believe this'. He asked REST to give him a moment to compose himself.



Stepping over the rise - what a sight. Over a 1,000 people. We were escorted in by a rider, on a pony dressed for the occasion. The dancers enfolded us into their midst and encouraged us to join their circle, singing and ululating. There was nothing for it but to join in with tears trickling down our faces. Everyone wanted to see us, they were on shoulders, in trees and standing on boulders. We had many speeches, the Priests said prayers of thanks and many villagers also thanked us for being there in person and for donating a well.



It was overwhelming, we considered we'd done so little, but they felt as if God had sent us. One eloquent female speaker said to us at one such village welcome Ifor we had many following that first oneI that it wasn't just the fact that we'd donated money for a well, but that we actually took the trouble to come to visit. That meant a lot to us, but apparently meant so much more to them. The providers of clean water were no longer invisible and a mutual bond had been established. We explained we were the conduit for many people and had the privilege to be a WellWishers representative in their homes.
