Put yourself in Letbrhan Hailu’s shoes.....

If you did, you’d be a 32 year old mother with 3 boys & 3 girls between 2 and 14, living in a remote village desparate to receive a well. We know this because we visited her in a “Needy Village” last year.

And being in Letbrhan’s shoes, your “normal” day would be like this:

- You wake up at 3 am, then fetch water until 7 am.
- From 7am to 8 am, you prepare breakfast for your 6 children & husband
- Up until midday you prepare lunch and look after the sheep & goats.
- After lunch, you help your husband in the field with the harvest, or 3 times a week you spend 3 hours each time, collecting firewood
- From 6 pm to 7 pm, you prepare dinner.
- After dinner, you do household activities - washing for example.
- You go to sleep at midnight
- After 3 hours sleep, the daily cycle starts again

It is nigh on impossible to imagine living Letbrhan’s life; yet there are countless living like her throughout Ethiopia.



18 yr old FREZER’S VISIT TO A COMMUNITY WELL

I had been in Ethiopia, the country I had left 11 years earlier (when I was being adopted), for a month now. I hadn’t known what to expect, but here I was, amazed and in love with my country. I felt I was back home and once again I experienced my love for Ethiopia.

This day, Solomon arrived in a 4WD vehicle and while we had never met him, we guessed immediately who he was and without further ado we were driving on a dusty, unsealed road, marked by a myriad of Chinese sponsored road works, towards the town of Adwa. A little distance from Adwa, through dry looking hills and across dry, stoney paddocks we reached the community well. We were led to the stone-walled, circular enclosure and greeted by community people - older men and women, younger ones and little children. We saw the pump, simple and light, being used by a small girl probably no older than 8 years, as she filled a yellow plastic container. Solomon introduced us.

The community welcomed us and thanked us for visiting. They shared with us how much the clean water meant to them. Through Solomon, they explained that about 250 families benefited from this clean water each day and how people were now much healthier because they no longer used dirty water. Girls and women now had more time for other things such as education. It is hard for me to really imagine giving up my schooling to go and fetch water each day and I felt grateful for my education in Australia. It is amazing how different my life is and will be because I have been adopted by my Australian family. Because of this I feel that the career I choose must be able to provide me with the opportunity to help Ethiopian people; women, girls and children in particular. Dad took photos and mum talked through Solomon for us.



We felt special and privileged. We also felt that we wanted to go back to Australia and raise money for a well. Dad, mum and I all shared a sense of how can something so basic be so ‘provided for us’ but ‘such a gift’ for these people. We will raise the money for a well. People in our country spend so much money on extra things, going out to eat, clothes, mobile phones and expensive entertainment, that we are sure the money is there.
